Reserve Officer Review Project

In the next few weeks, ILEA will begin conducting a thorough review of agencies who utilize Reserve Officers. The purpose of this project is to ensure we have an accurate roster for those agencies utilizing Reserve Officers and to verify that ILEA has proper documentation for Reserve Officers who are carrying weapons.

Additionally, we will review the time tables for any Reserve Officer currently enrolled in the training/certification process. All Chiefs and Sheriffs will receive an email from Reserve Liaison Valerie Hawthorne in the near future asking for a point-of-contact with your department. Your responses and assistance with this process are greatly appreciated.

ILEA APPROVED PROCTORS

We appreciate those who assist us by serving as ILEA approved proctors. If you are expiring at the end of 2024 and wish to continue serving in the role, refresh yourself on current proctor processes by reviewing the online <u>Proctor Course</u> and then submit a <u>Proctor application</u>. BASIC ACADEMY CLASS

As their class project, Classes 317 and 318 raised money and purchased items to fill over 600 packages with sweatshirts, socks, balls, books, and games. Recruits partnered with the Des Moines Public School District and Safer Families for Children to identify children and families with the greatest needs. The packages were distributed to children at the First Church of the Open Bible, Kingdom Life Family Ministries International, and Christian Life Assembly of God.







HOW MUCH DOES ILEA BASIC ACADEMY COST?

Presently, the total expense for the 16 week Basic Academy is approximately \$7,794 per recruit. The costs break down like this:

- Tuition/Lodging \$4800 (reflects agency's 1/3 of total cost)
- Meal Plan
 \$2940
- Clothing \$230 (ordered through Iowa Prison Industries)
- Duty Ammo \$150 (approximate cost of 250 rounds supplied by agency)

- TASER training \$100
- PIT training \$225
- Rolling Roadblock \$100
