RESERVE OFFICER WEAPON LAW



Reserve Officers who carry weapons must be approved by their governing body and certified by the Academy Council prior to carrying a weapon. Iowa law states the following:

80D.7 Carrying weapons.

A member of a reserve force shall not carry a weapon in the line of duty until the member has been approved by the governing body and certified by the council to carry weapons. After approval and certification, a reserve peace officer may carry a weapon in the line of duty only when authorized by the chief of police, sheriff, commissioner of public safety or the commissioner's designee, or director of the lowa department of corrections or the director's designee, as the case may be.

IOWA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACCREDITATION PROGRAM (ILEAP)

The **lowa Law Enforcement Accreditation Program (ILEAP)** is accepting applications for agencies seeking accreditation, marking a major step forward in elevating professional policing standards across lowa. This new state-level, voluntary program provides a more accessible alternative to national accreditation through CALEA, which has historically been difficult for smaller departments to achieve. Funded through a U.S. Department of Justice COPS Office grant and supported by the lowa Police Chiefs Association (IPCA) and the lowa State Sheriffs and Deputies Association (ISSDA), ILEAP offers a practical framework for agencies of all sizes to meet modern, effective law enforcement standards while reducing liability risks.

ILEAP aims to strengthen accountability, transparency, and community trust by ensuring participating agencies adhere to nationally recognized best practices. The program is designed to be affordable and sustainable, reflecting lowa's commitment to professional excellence in public safety. Accreditation demonstrates an agency's dedication to continuous improvement, external evaluation, and responsible policing. To encourage participation, a limited number of grants are available to cover initial application fees and software costs. Iowa law enforcement agencies are encouraged to join this initiative to enhance service quality and reinforce public confidence across the state.

REGISTER ON ACADIS

Must register for sessions independently

There are three requisites to becoming a Below 100 instructor:

- 1. Attendees must be active or retired, full-time, sworn law enforcement.
 - 2. Attendees must be experienced presenters.
- Attendees must attend a Below 100 course. A Below 100 course is held immediately prior to the Below 100 Instructor and Implementation Course, so the training can be completed in one day.
